My name is Krisztina and I am a 27-year-old Hungarian girl. I was working at a farm in Mesa County and got involved with a co-worker. Unfortunately, I became pregnant. I did not know what to do so I returned to Hungary in February to live with my parents. They were not financially able to support the baby and me. My parents divorced when I was three, and from then on I was shuffled back and forth. My father, an alcoholic, was unable to help me and my mother has a fiancé and I couldn't stay there either. I called my friend in Mesa County and asked her if I could stay with her, she said yes. I was in love with the co-worker, and father of my child so I returned to America in April, believing to marry him and raise our child. After arriving here and because I would not abort the baby, the man abandoned me.

As I have no income and am unable to work in my present condition, the elderly Hungarian lady took compassion for me and took me into her home to temporarily help me. This 75-year-old lady is not in the best of health and has very limited resources.

My baby girl will be born in mid July. Some friends of the lady I am staying with gave me a baby shower and I received a lot of baby items. I am still in need of bassinet, diapers, and really any other baby items someone might have. I would be very grateful for any form of help that can be extended to me.

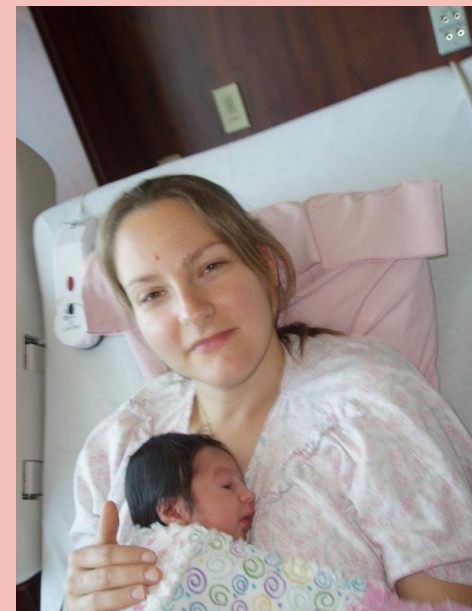

When I asked her what her biggest dream is, she said that she would like to stay in America for a least a couple of years, get a job, a home for her and her baby and then see what happens.

Krisztina has her Master's degree in Agriculture Engineering from Hungry. She came here to learn English and to further her opportunities, with that in mind she got a job at a local farm, she worked there for almost two years until she got pregnant.

Krisztina will to do any kind of work. She was completely happy working at the farm but she could not



do the work in her precious condition. Krisztina just wants to be independent and raise her daughter. She has learned English and just a beautiful young girl.

During our time together, Krisztina accepted Jesus as her Personal Savior!!!!!!

UPDATE!!! Baby Lili was born TODAY!!! I went to the hospital and took some pictures for you! 6lbs 5 oz of preciousness!!! And check out all that Hair!!! What a difference ONE day Makes!!!

I learned during our visit that just one month ago Krisztina lost her dad, he was an alcoholic, and simply drank himself to death. She is happy she did get to see him before he died.

We are looking for help for Krisztina for the baby items. She has received a crib and clothing for the newborn, but will need all other items, most immediate need will be a bassinet and diapers.

Once the baby is born, Krisztina would love to go back to work here in Mesa County, get an apartment and be independent. HOPE of the Grand Valley will stick with Krisztina throughout this process and guide her to where she needs to go to accomplish this as well as getting Krisztina legal help via Colorado Legal Services for the Visa.
